

Improving care for patients with heart and lung disease

At ECHO we have been advocating for our members regarding plans to change heart (cardiovascular) and lung and breathing (respiratory) services for patients.

Now it is your turn to give your views.

These proposed changes are being discussed jointly in partnership by Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust, Royal Brompton and Harefield Hospitals, Evelina London Children's Hospital and partners King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust and King's Health Partners.

The partners want to create a global powerhouse for heart and lung medicine and research in London, providing the best possible patient care and experience. This includes the development of a new purpose-built clinical academic facility on the St Thomas' Hospital and Evelina London Children's Hospital site.

They are now inviting patients with a heart or lung condition, their carers and families, to help explore improvements in the way heart and lung care is provided in the future.

This is an opportunity for all ECHO members to design the kind of care you and your family and other patients will receive in the future.

Workshops for parents and carers of children and young people
